Rosary Whirlwind British Isles – October 2020 for Faith, Life & Peace

October is traditionally the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary.

Nations around the world are hosting their great Rosary Crusades and we join them, especially Ireland in a great union of prayer.

Once again Catholics across England, Wales, Scotland and the Isles are invited to take up their rosaries for an intensive Rosary Whirlwind Mission for the spiritual well-being of the British Isles and for its preservation from degeneration, disaster, sickness and war.

Daily we are witnessing increasing levels of violence, rebellion and lawlessness. The Church is under great attack, the faith is being undermined, the sanctity of life is not honoured and peace is lacking everywhere. The covid-19 global pandemic threatens a second wave – people are fearful of what the future may hold. More than ever we need to intercede for our Isles and for the conversion to Christ of our peoples and that they be protected from all danger, from all sickness and from all evil.

Our refuges are the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary with the mantle of protection of St. Michael & the Angels, St. Joseph, and our Saints & Martyrs.

Rosary Whirlwind will invoke the mighty intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary inviting a WHIRLWIND of Heavenly Grace to blow where it wills across our Nations.

1. Daily recitation of the Rosary on line from the following sites at 8pm each evening throughout October.

2. On the 31st October this event will finish with a continuous Rosary recitation across the British Isles from 9am – 9pm.

3. On the 13th October throughout the British Isles individual Parish Groups are encouraged within Covid restrictions to recite the Rosary at a time and place of their choosing. This

Home Visits

It is possible at the moment to visit in the garden or any outside place. So if you would like me to visit you please contact me at the Parish on 01208 72833. In the near future we also hope that this will include bringing Holy Communion to our sick and housebound parishioners.

Please note in line with new government regulations it is now mandatory to wear facial coverings when attending places of worship.

You are expected to wear a face covering immediately before entering and it must be kept on until you leave.

NHS Covid-19

We have now been issued with our QR Code and if you have downloaded the app on your phone you can now scan the code which will automatically track and trace you. If you do not have the app and therefore are unable to use this system can you please fill out your form as usual. The QR Code is situated in the doorway on the right hand side as you enter church and you simply need to open your app and click on **venue check-in**. There is a separate code for each church.

Track and Trace

We are obliged to fill out these forms for each mass we attend. **Please ensure you put the date and time of the Mass on your track and trace slip.**

This is an added precaution we are taking in case we are contacted by the Track & Trace system. This would only happen if they are notified of a person who has attended one of our masses and has gone on to show symptoms.

We have to the best of our ability and Government/Diocese guidelines made Church a safe space for our parishioners to attend

Please be aware that precautions have been put in place to make your visit as safe as possible. Please do not attend mass if you are on the at risk list. Numbers will be limited. The toilet is closed until further notice.

If you have had a cough, temperature or other signs of symptoms please do not attend.

Mass

The Mass is what our faith is all about especially Sunday Mass. Mass will be said every day at St Mary's so if you would rather come when there might not be many people attending then do come to one of the daily masses. It is very important to emphasise that the Sunday obligation, at present, remains suspended.

Due to the ongoing Covid 19 we have to take great care in the way we come together.

- 1. There is no obligation to come to Mass**
- 2. If you are in any way unwell or with any underlying condition DO NOT COME.**
- 3. When you come you will have a designated seat at a safe distance from others**
- 4. We ask you to wear a face covering throughout the Mass.**
- 5. The mass will be shorter (no singing).**
- 6. Communion will be at the end of Mass.**
- 7. There will be stewards on duty to help with the new procedures.**

It is important to follow the guidelines below:

- Hands will be sanitised on entering the church**
- Guidance to your seat will be given**
- No kneeling – sitting or standing permitted only**
- Communion will be by hand only**
- No candles will be available for lighting**

Please do not return to your seats after receiving Communion but go directly out of Church as it is necessary to close it for cleaning.



Foodbank

Although we are no longer collecting donations in our churches there is still a great need for this work to continue. Most supermarkets have a basket/box for donations which are then collected by the Foodbank. Please keep this in mind when you are doing your weekly shop and maybe buy something extra to donate.
