We are hoping to rearrange the final Synodal meetings in the last week of January. **Tuesday** 25<sup>th</sup> at Padstow, **Friday** 28<sup>th</sup> at Wadebridge and **Sunday** 30<sup>th</sup> at Bodmin & Tintagel.

### Padstow:

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is from 18-25th January. Churches Together, which is the organization locally now chaired by Rev Fiona Giorla with Sister Deirdre as vice Chair, arranges each year an ecumenical service hosted in rotation by the Anglicans, Catholics or Methodists. The service this year will take place on Sunday 23rd January at 3pm in St Petroc's shared church and is to be hosted by the Catholic community and led by Father Ciaran. This year's theme is "We saw His star in the east". It would be wonderful to have good support for this important occasion from the Catholic community.

### White Flower Appeal 2022

The Society for the Protection of Unborn children (SPUC) will be holding its annual appeal this weekend. SPUC is currently campaigning to protect Pro-Life speech. Pro-Life witness is being restricted now more than ever; we must be able to speak freely to protect unborn babies. 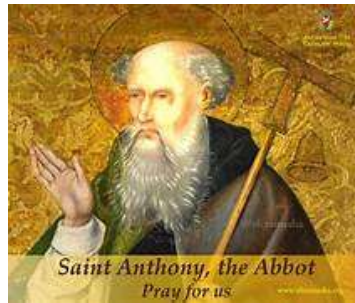
**Tuesday 8 February 2022** Refugees and Migrants Online Event 5-6pm

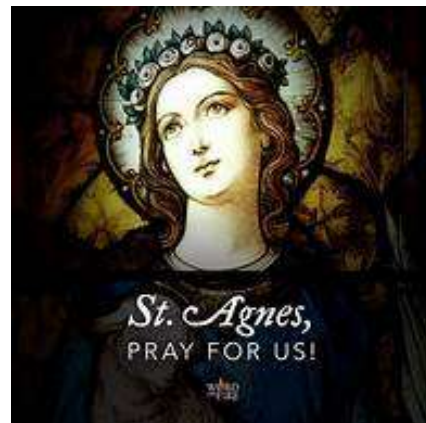
